HEART TO HEART.....by Rev. Scott M. Sunnenberg


Dear Parishioners,

Reverence for the Holy Eucharist, especially in our communal worship, is always of grave importance. We can never forget or fail to recognize the real presence of Jesus Christ, Body, Blood, Soul, & Divinity in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. There are many ways that we express this reverence, from genuflecting toward the Tabernacle as we enter and leave our pew (before and after Mass), a clear and audible AMEN in response to the priest speaking "The Body of Christ", considering our thoughtful and prayerful reception in the hand or upon the tongue at Communion, returning to our pews for a few moments of silent thanksgiving immediately following our reception of the Host. I'd like to address one point in particular about the sign of reverence just before our individual reception in the communion line. Our bishop has encouraged each communicant to bow before presenting to receive the Host. This is considered a communal act of reverence, much like saying AMEN. Some parishioners have recently expressed a personal desire to receive communion while kneeling. This expression of reverence is a personal choice. In sensitivity to this request and so as not to make kneeling on the floor difficult and disruptive to the flow of our communion line, a kneeler will be made available to the left of the priest (the left hand side of the altar). Those wishing to use it should proceed in the normal communion line, making their way immediately to the kneeler at the regular time. Those wishing not to use it should proceed as always. Let me clearly state that a reverent reception can be made either way. *I do ask that kneeling on the floor now that a kneeler is available be discontinued.*

Please notice the beautiful PCCW bulletin board for Life featured in this month of January when we celebrate the March for Life and sadly commemorate the decision of Roe vs. Wade in our Supreme Court. Many innocent lives have been lost in the wake of that sad day and many men and women alike have been physically and emotionally harmed. Families, communities and our nation continue to pay the price. The excellent information and available pamphlets provide the opportunity to further one's awareness and deepen one's prayer and witness in the defense of life. Thank you to the Leadership Committee of our PCCW and their chair Maggie Kluthe for all the effort they put in to this project. This Saturday marks the 49th anniversary of Roe vs. Wade. I invite you to join with me and many Catholics around the United States in making this day a day of prayer and reparation. Please consider offering some sort of sacrifice on that day. Perhaps offer up a meal, make it a day of fasting, come a little early or stay a little late for Mass to pray for this intention. Maybe give up eating out or dessert on that day. Why not be creative and find some sort of sacrifice in honor of all the lives extinguished these past 49 years. Please remember that on Sunday morning at 10:15, there will be a blessing for all mothers who are carrying children at this time in the womb. All are invited to come and be present for this blessing, especially our expectant mothers.
