Dear Parishioners:

Recently our Parish Council discussed having a procession on Corpus Christi Sunday, June 11th, (The Solemnity of the Body & Blood of Christ). It is at the request of Bishop Rice that our diocesan parishes highlight this great solemnity in light of the Eucharistic Revival taking place and in preparation for the National Eucharistic Congress in 2024. To this end, we have decided to hold our Eucharistic procession at St. Wenceslaus Cemetery. In order to call to mind both the sacredness of that place and the connection of the Church Militant (the faithful on earth, the Church Triumphant, the faithful in heaven, and the church suffering-those in purgatory) all united in the Most Holy Eucharist. When we pray before the Blessed Sacrament, we pray for one another, for those who have gone before us, and for those in purgatory. As we adore Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, we see the Way, the Truth and the Life to which we are called. Please mark your calendars for this unique opportunity. The procession will begin immediately following the 10:30 a.m. Mass at Sacred Heart. We will have a procession in vehicles to the cemetery where we will continue a procession on foot with the Most Holy Sacrament. The procession will end under the awning with a time of prayer and Benediction. Please feel free to bring lawn chairs if standing is difficult for you. Those that can are asked to walk in the procession. There will be an ice-cream social following the procession and benediction. Please bring a topping to share. Ice-cream, bowls, napkins, etc. will be provided.

Thank you to those who attended the EMHC (Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion) training that took place Wednesday of this past week. I very much enjoyed sharing a few words of encouragement and I hope insight into this very important ministry. Thank you also to those who expressed their willingness to be Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to homebound, hospitals and nursing homes.
