Dear Parishioners,

It's with great joy and thanksgiving to God that our church has a new Pope! The cardinal electors on Thursday, May 8th, chose Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost, originally from Chicago, Illinois. Cardinal Prevost was serving in the Vatican Curia Office responsible for selecting bishops around the world. He also served as a Bishop in Peru and as a missionary. He was ordained a priest for the Augustinian Friars prior to being sent on mission. Upon election, as the Pope, Cardinal Prevost chose the name Leo XIV. Let us welcome in prayer with love and receptivity our new Holy Father! It is the duty of every Catholic to pray for our Pope, our Bishops, our Priests, our Religious, our Deacons, our Seminarians, and each other. We do this at every Mass when we gather together. Let us continue to do it in our personal prayer as well. May God bless Pope Leo XIV and may the Holy Spirit guide and direct him as he shepherds our Church.

Very soon you will see men at work tearing out the cobblestone sections of our parking lot that are fractured and needing replacement. The whole parish was able to rejoice and remember our own First Communion as we watched and prayed. May the day of First Communion be for these young people the beginning of a life-long and ever-deepening love for Jesus and the Most Blessed Sacrament of His Body and Blood. Our parish CCW hosted a delightful reception following Mass that continued the celebration and was enjoyed by many. Thank you to them for their service and dedication. Lastly, I wish to thank our First Communion Ed, for their support, guidance, and encouragement of these First Communicants.

This weekend we observe on Sunday, *World Day of Prayer for Vocations*. Do you know a young man who: 1. regularly attends Sunday Mass and/or daily Mass? 2. Comes to confession? 3. Can be found praying before, after and at other times at church? 4. Volunteers and attends parish events? This person might have a vocation to the priesthood. What can you do? 1. Pray for them; 2. Speak to them a word of encouragement; 3. Recognize in them the signs they themselves may not yet see.

May is the month of the rosary. Many people use their rosaries daily. St. Padre Pio called the rosary our greatest weapon. Please join us before Masses for a communal rosary led by your fellow parishioners if you don't already do so. Consider praying the rosary as a family throughout this month, or maybe start carrying the rosary in your purse or pocket as a reminder if you don't already do so. Bishop Rice often tells our young people to always keep a rosary within their reach.
