

ANNUAL SAFE ENVIRONMENT BULLETIN ANNOUNCEMENT: Reporting Procedures of Known or Suspected Abuse or Misconduct Any known or suspected abuse or neglect of a minor must first be immediately reported to the Missouri Child Abuse and Neglect Hotline at 800-392-3738. Any known or suspected abuse or neglect of an adult must first be immediately reported to the Missouri Adult Abuse and Neglect Hotline at 800-392-0210. In situations of immediate danger, call 911. Known or suspected abuse may also be reported to law enforcement in addition to making a report to the MO Child Abuse and Neglect Hotline or to the MO Adult Abuse and Neglect Hotline.

Violations of The Code of Conduct should also be reported to the Director of the Office of Child and Youth Protection at childdandyouthprotection@dioscrg.org or (417) 866-0841 or through the TIPS online reporting system available on the diocesan website www.dioscrg.org.

Violations involving the Bishop should be reported to the Catholic Bishop Abuse Reporting System at 800-276-1562 or <https://reportbishopabuse.org/>.

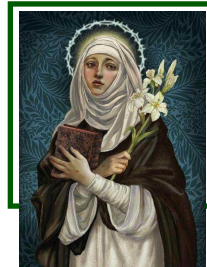
SAFE ENVIRONMENT REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL DIOCESAN PERSONNEL—Clergy, Employees and Adult volunteers: The mission and ministry of creating a safe environment for all to flourish and thrive is a responsibility we all share.

Before regularly working or volunteering with minors or vulnerable adults, all diocesan personnel are required to first complete 1) the Safe Environment Training; 2) have a Background Screening conducted; and, 3) submit the current and signed Code of Conduct.

The Safe Environment training is now available online after creating an account in the VIRTUS system (through the VIRTUS webpage <https://www.virtusonline.org/virtus/>). The background screening application is also now completed through the VIRTUS account.

The Code of Conduct, which is required annually and made available at the beginning of every school year, the Background Consent form, as well as all other required Safe Environment Policies and forms are available on the Diocese website, under the Office of Child and Youth Protection <https://dioscrg.org/child-youth-protection/>.

Saint of the Week: St. Josaphat

St. Josaphat was a strong advocate for the Union of Brest, a 1596 agreement that sought to bring the Ruthenian Church under the authority of the Catholic Church while maintaining its Byzantine traditions. He worked to implement reforms in the church, which he saw as a way to demonstrate the value of the union to his followers. He became a Basilian monk and eventually rose to become the Archbishop of Polotsk. As archbishop, he worked to restore the church's buildings, enforce clerical conduct, and provide pastoral care. He published catechisms and other works to educate the faithful and fought to maintain the unique traditions of the Eastern Catholic churches while remaining in communion with Rome.

St. Josaphat was violently opposed by those who rejected the Union of Brest. On November 12, 1623, a mob attacked his residence, and he was killed with axes, clubs, and gunshots. His body was dragged through the streets and thrown into a river, but it was later recovered.

Miracles were reported to have occurred shortly after his death, and his martyrdom spurred numerous conversions to Catholicism. One of his murderers later expressed that he had become a tool for Josaphat's mission even after his death.

He was canonized as a saint by the Catholic Church in 1867. He is considered the first saint of the Eastern Catholic Church and is a patron saint of Ukraine. Josaphat, an Eastern Rite bishop, is held up as a martyr to church unity because he died trying to bring part of the Orthodox Church into union with Rome. His feast day is November 12. resource is
