











Jesse Tree

The tradition of the Jesse Tree is rooted in the scripture passage from Isaiah 11:1: "A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots." Jesse was the father of King David, and Jesus is a descendent from the line of King David. Decorating a Jesse Tree is a great way to prepare for Advent by focusing on Jesus' family tree events. Each day during Advent, an ornament hung on the tree that depicts a story from Jesus' family tree leading up to His birth.
